
Since beginning in 2002, the EGDS study has collected more than 3,500 questions from you! A study of this enormous proportion and value has attracted the attention and respect of researchers across the world. Our research team is busy writing papers, presenting at conferences, and training new researchers (graduate students). Do you ever wonder why we ask the same questions over and over? Our interview questions have been created, tested, and published by other researchers and are respected in the scientific community as ways to measure topics like social support, sleep problems, depression, and self esteem. Sometimes we ask the same questions each time we visit, but sometimes we ask them in a slightly different way. This can be frustrating, we know! We use this technique to increase the amount of data we have and our chances of publishing our findings. We greatly appreciate your cooperation and answering all of the questions.

We've traveled approximately 3,632,508 miles to see everyone since the study began. That's roughly eight roundtrips to the moon!


Who Are You?
